What have you (or a friend / relative) experienced which you can use to relate to your students' area of work?


Benefits:

- Helps bridge the gap between your (lack of) knowledge, and students' expertise
- Helps demonstrate your interest in their work
- May help exploit relevant corporate documentation for follow-up language work. What industry/ies do your students work in? How can / do you relate to their work?

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2. Corporate materials (brochures; websites)

If potentially 'boring', look at the pages of a <u>different</u> department, or the website of a <u>rival</u> company. (e.g.?)



3. Finding out about the students / their needs

- Needs Analysis
- Getting to know your students
- General chat


Use step-by-step activities (e.g. **Framework Materials** – see REFERENCES) to help structure student talk / discussions about common issues at work.

4. **Industry-related podcasts** [Become a podcast-listener yourself, first!] Find good industry-related podcasts, and introduce your students to them; encourage them to listen at home (with a task), and report back.



5. Course book use & personalization

A good course book helps structure your course. Look for opportunities specifically at the start & end of each section or unit for students to relate to the material. 'Lift' activities off the page, and structure them.
