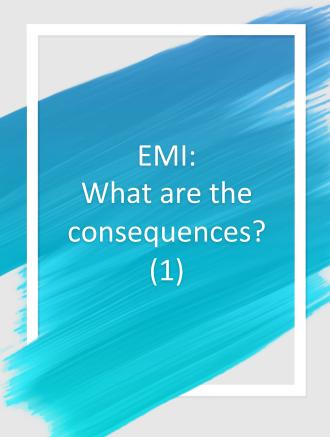


What is "EMI"?

[English Medium Instruction]

The use of the English language to teach academic subjects (other than English itself) in countries [...] in which the majority of the population's first language is not English.

(Dearden, 2015)

The better the spoken English of the lecturer, the better the learning.

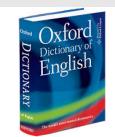


Teaching in an EMI context Task 1 Questions such as "Do you understand?" are an effective means of checking if students are on task.

A dictionary definition is generally one of the most effective ways to explain a new term or concept.





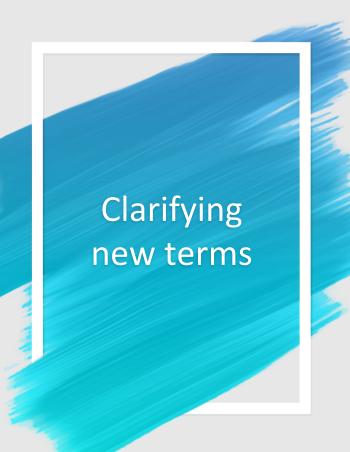
